The Filtration Society was formed in London in 1964 as a charitable organisation, with the objective of both collating existing filtration and separation technologies and promoting research and development into new areas. As a result the Society has equally strong links with industry and academia. The official journal of the Society FILTRATION has become the foremost international scientific publication of its kind and is an invaluable reference for scientists and engineers.



The Society has organised over 150 conferences so far to discuss the latest engineering and scientific developments, including regular reviews of the global market for filtration and separation products. As such they attract a high international presence.

The Suttle Award, named after the first chairman of the Society, Harold K Suttle, is given in recognition of the achievements of younger workers in the field of filtration and separation.
